**Reality:** The Welfare to Work program is designed to meet participants where they are. Our approach is centered around understanding and addressing the unique barriers that may be preventing individuals from finding or maintaining employment. While we encourage and support employment, we recognize that not everyone is immediately ready to enter the workforce. Some participants may benefit more from additional schooling, training, or referrals to other support services. Our goal is to provide the resources and assistance needed to help each person move forward at their own pace.

  - Helps pay overdue and/or current bills which accrued during any timeframe.
